Bids will be received by Gray Photography Studio, Inc Board of Directors, 997 NE 10th Ave., St. John, KS Kansas 67576 until 12:00 on November 19, 2021 for the work noted above according to plans approved by the Kansas State Historic Preservation Office. This structure is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. All work must comply with the Secretary of the Interior's *Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties*.

Sealed bids will be publicly opened at 12:00 noon on November 19, 2021 at 311 Broadway, St. John, KS.

Bids will be received on a total bid price basis and will include a sum to cover the cost of all items of the contract, including insurance, materials, and performance bonds. A pre-bid meeting will be held at Gray Photography Studio, 116 N. Main, St. John, KS on Friday, November 5, 2021 at 9:00 am. Proposals received after the date and time indicated above for opening will be considered late, and therefore will not be considered for award. The Bid will be awarded on the basis of cost and performance; to the Bidder who, in the Owner's judgment, is the lowest, most qualified, responsible and responsive Bidder. Owner reserves the right to reject any and all Bids and to reject the Bid of any Bidder if the Owner believes it would not be in the best interest of Owner to make an award to that Bidder. Project Description:

Exterior Paint

Building Description:

Gray Photography Studio is a structure built in the late 1800s and is a single story wood-framed building with a mezzanine style second level at the west end of the building that houses an apartment. Repairs to the roof, framing, windows, exterior, and electrical/plumbing are necessary to save the building and for it to serve a purpose as a community arts center.

Detail of Work

Existing paint will be scraped by mechanical methods (scraper, belt sander with caution), primer applied, and a top coat of white oil based exterior paint will be applied.

General Conditions:

- All work to be in accordance with the Secretary of the Interior's *Standards for Rehabilitation* - <http://www.nps.gov/history/hps/tps/tax/rehabstandards.htm>..
- Certificates of insurance, performance, and materials payment bonds are required as security for faithful performance and the payment of all bills and obligation arising from the contract.
- Storage and handling of all materials must be in a manner, which prevents additional loss, deterioration, and damage; storage area to be designated by project administrator.
- Construction schedule to be itemized with headings related to the breakdown in payment requests.
- All work is subject to review by the Kansas State Historical Society throughout the duration of the project.
- Compliance with all applicable laws and statutory regulations is required.
